

- Competed in the singles and doubles qualifying rounds at the Australian Open as well as the qualifying rounds of the Wimbledon doubles



- Krunic first picked up a racquet at the age of 7. She trained at the famous Spartak Moscow club, where man many grand slam champions developed their games.
- Won her first WTA title in 2018 's-Hertogenbosch with CEO Sarah Stone as her coach
- All court player who is know for being one of the fastest players on tour. Her favorite shot is the drop shot and she has a very heavy forehand.
- Recently completed her undergraduate degree in Economics
- · Her tennis idols growing up were Mary Pierce and Kim Clijsters
- Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist and Master Performance Tennis Specialist with over 25 years of experience in the field

- Defeated Martina Navratilova in the round of 16 at the French Open, Navratilova's only loss in 87 singles matches throughout the 1983 season
- Earned an MBA at the Wharton School of Business at the University of Pennsylvania
- 1993 French Open Doubles Champion alongside brother Murphy Jensen, reaching a career-high world doubles ranking of No. 6
- Competed for the University of Southern California, earning singles All-American honors in 1986 and 1987, as well as doubles All-American honors in 1987
- Won 10 doubles titles throughout his professional career and was known as "Dual Hand Luke" for his ability to serve at 130 MPH with both hands
- Coached the Syracuse University women's tennis team from 2006-2014, amassing a career record of 106-57
- Currently serves as the Director of Racquet Sports at the prestigious West Side Tennis
 Club in Forest Hills, New York



- Co-founder of the Global Water Foundation, which raises millions of dollars to provide clean drinking water to third-world countries
- Celebrated orthopedic surgeon with a specialization in sports medicine, most famous for pioneering the procedure for articular cartilage reconstruction using two-phased cartilage grafts
- Currently serves as the founder and Medical Director of the U.S. Center for Sports Medicine in Kirkwood, Missouri
- Inducted into both the St. Louis Sports Hall of Fame and the Missouri Sports Hall of Fame for his work in sports medicine and orthopedic surgery
- Author of three books on tennis injuries, as well as numerous tennis articles in orthopedic and sports medicine journals
- Acted as the team physician for the Florida Panthers, Tampa Bay Lighting, St. Louis Blues, and covered four Olympic Games with USA Track and Field
- Regarded as one of the top junior coaches in the world, Lucero has led multiple players to No. 1 rankings in the United States and coached them to singles national championships

- Rose to No. 3 in the singles rankings and was ranked in the world top-50 for 12 consecutive seasons from 1978-1989, seven of which were in the top-10
- Became the third woman to win Grand Slam titles on grass, clay, and hard courts
- Won the 1989 US Open doubles title alongside Martina Navratilova
- Coached Jana Novotna to the 1998 Wimbledon singles title and a career high ranking of No. 2, while also serving as the Czech Republic's Olympic and Fed Cup coach through 1996
- Mental health counselor and sports physiotherapist with over 30 years of experience, holding a Master's degree in Counseling and a Bachelor's degree in Physiotherapy
- Currently serves as the WTA's Senior Director of Athlete Assistance, assisting players in the areas of emotional health and safety
- Acts as a member of the International Olympic Committee (IOC) expert group on harassment and abuse prevention in sport
- Worked as the Player Welfare Officer for the International Tennis Federation from 2009-2016
- Served as the Australian Fed Cup Team physiotherapist from 1994-2000, Sports Medicine Services Manager for Tennis Australia from 1998-2004, and the 2000 Australian Olympic Team Physiotherapist
- Lawyer at Newkirk Zwagerman Law Firm, P.L.C., which represents employees who have been denied equal employment, equal opportunity or who have been harassed at work based on their sex, skin color, age and other personal characteristics
- Focuses primarily on discrimination law, specifically the representation of African Americans and women in their pursuit of an equitable share of the benefits of American society
- Currently works on practice methods better suited to successfully deal with modern cases of racism, sexism, and hidden bias
- Worked extensively on sports bias law suits, including multiple cases involving Title IX


